Please find enclosed the statutory notice of your rent increase for 2022/23. You will see that your rent has been increased by 4.1 % in line with Government guidance which will come into effect from April 2022.

Help is available to those in financial need

We know that in the last 12 months things have been tough. More expensive gas and electricity bills, rising food prices and the Government's planned National Insurance tax increase, will continue to put severe pressure on household budgets this year. That's why Enfield Council is committed to helping residents who are struggling to pay their bills.

Enfield Council spends £38m annually on our **Council Tax Support Scheme**. This is financial support to a third of households in our borough to help pay their Council Tax. You can check your eligibility at www.enfield.gov.uk/benefits. This checker will also advise if you are eligible to claim Housing Benefit or Universal Credit.
