Police foil illegal rave at New Southgate

Monday, 7 December 2015 By Dave Speck in Local People

Police moved in to stop an illegal rave taking place at an industrial unit in New Southgate.

Officers say a door had been damaged to gain entry and the electricity supply had been tampered with at the unit, at Brunswick Industrial Park, where organisers had set up professional speakers, event lighting, scaffolding and decorations. There was also a small shop to sell alcohol.

Sergeant Jamie Kay said: "Quick intervention from our emergency response team, together with help from a dog unit and officers from the Territorial Support Unit, ensured this incident did not escalate.

"We used legislation to prevent disruption to neighbouring residential properties allowed us to shut down this unlicensed event."

A 49-year-old man was arrested for criminal damage to the electricity system at the unit but was later released without charge following the incident which took place on Saturday November 28.

Acting on "received information," police say a public order and disruption plan was developed alongside relevant authorities under the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act.


